The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the Town of Harman pursue a \$1,500,000 DWTRF PF loan, and a 1,000,000 IJDC grant for an estimated project cost of \$2,500,000

Economic Development Assistance

Webster County Economic Development Authority Loan

2024E-217

The Webster County Economic Development Authority is requesting a loan in the amount of \$1,600,000 for construction of 23,000 square foot building in Cowen, WV in support of the Custard Stand Food Products, LLC project.

MOTION:

I MOVE THAT a loan to the Webster County Economic Development Authority (2024E-217) in the amount of \$1,600,000 for the new construction of a building that will serve Custard Stand Food Products, LLC in Cowen, West Virginia be approved, with the following terms:

- 1. A loan not to exceed \$1.6 million.
- 2. The loan shall be for 18 years from the date of closing with an interest rate of 1.00%.
- 3. Principal and interest will be deferred for a period of 3 years after loan closing.
- **4.** If Custard Stand Food Products, LLC has created 20 full time jobs within 3 years of closing, the principal balance of the loan shall be reduced by \$300,000.
- **5.** Should Custard Stand Products, LLC not create 20 full time jobs within this period, \$15,000 for every job not created will be subtracted from the \$300,000. The remaining amount shall be applied to the \$1.6 million loan to reduce the principal.
- **6.** Loan closing will be subject to an acceptable lease between the Webster County EDA and Custard Stand Food Products, LLC.
- 7. The IJDC will have a pro rata shared first lien position with First Community Bank.
- **8.** Any additional terms and conditions shall be negotiated by the West Virginia Water Development Authority on behalf of the Infrastructure Jobs and Development Council., **BE APPROVED**

Joe Brouse moved that the recommendation be approved, Virginia King and seconded the motion. The Motion passed.
